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## A Journey through the frazen maments in time Curatars note


Dating back to the Second Century BC, the Ajanta Caves in Western India, resplendent with some of India's oldest known Buddhist art in a labyrinth of hollowed out rock extant, have inexorably drawn artists and historians back to reflect on them again and again over many centuries.

As the brush and the chisel worked in tandem, hundreds of unnamed artists whilst adhering to the traditions of the ancient Indian Art treatise, ventured on a bold exploration of monolithic, yet Hellenistic forms. Techniques and Artistry, Movements and Expressions merged as the multitudinal layers of narrative became timeless, frozen moments.


Dr. Seemanthini Desai revisits this poetry of Ajanta Art as her own artistic expression and philosophical journey of change and transformation. This body of work is an excellent example of her utter fascination for the dance of warm sunset on stone and sculpted rock. In painstaking detail she leads us to her viewpoint, to reflect on the sublime and the feminine, whilst dwelling on the vibrant grandeur of Ajanta, that even the ravages of time fail to conceal. Each of her six oil paintings was carefully selected to highlight her personal experiences when exploring all twenty-six caves in the Canyon. The extent of complexity, form and scale of work, subject and concept, that was orchestrated by these ancient masters inspires this body of work.

REVISITED is a contemporary take, a passionate dialogue on the passage of time, a poignant desire to remind us of our responsibility to protect what's left, revisit our need to create and reflect on lessons already learnt.






Teacher & Taught 7' x 8' Oil on Canvas




